Thank you for your email of 4 August 2022 in which you requested the following information:

"In the years 2019/20 and 2021(by year-end to include Reserves and TA) how many British Army personnel have failed the fitness test by Gender?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act). A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

Table 1. Number of British Army personnel by gender who failed a fitness test in the 2019 to 2021 calendar years

## Notes/caveats:

- 1. This data has been provided by a single Service source rather than official statistics produced by Defence Statistics as they do not collate this information.
- 2. The figures include both Regular and Reserve officers and soldiers.
- 3. The figures represent Annual Fitness Test (AFT) and Role Fitness Test (RFT) fails only and does not include the Soldier Conditioning Review (SCR). The SCR is not a pass / fail test, but a diagnostic fitness screening tool used by the Chain of Command to understand the fitness levels of their soldiers. It replaced the Personal Fitness Assessment (PFA) in 2019.
- 4. The RFT replaced the AFT for all personnel in Ground Close Combat (GCC) roles from 1 April 2019 and was introduced for non-GCC roles in 2021/22. Further information can be found at the link: https://www.army.mod.uk/physical-employment-standards/
