REQUEST FOR INFORMATION – INFORMATION RELATING TO AN INQUIRY INTO THE DEATHS OF MAJOR DAVID ANTHONY STORRY AND CFMN BRIAN DAVID HOPE ON 14 AUGUST 1972

I can confirm that your request has been considered under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI (A)), and the process is now complete.

You stated the following:

“On 24 Aug 1972 Maj David Anthony Storry and Cfmn Brian David Hope were killed by a bomb in Andersonstown Northern Ireland. I was the last person to see them alive and discovered their bodies. I understand an inquiry was made into their deaths, but I was not called to give evidence. I would very much like to know what conclusions were found. Could you please advise how I could go about getting a copy of this report?”

I can confirm that the MOD holds some information relating to your request which took place on the 14 August 1972 and not the date stipulated in your request. A copy of the Lisburn SIB Det Investigation Case File has been located and is provided at Annex A. Please note that all information that is redacted using a black box represents information that has been redacted under a Freedom of Information exemption.

Some of the information falls within the scope of Section 26 (Defence) of the FOI(A) as its release would or would be likely to prejudice the capability, effectiveness or security of any relevant forces. Section 26 is a qualified exemption and we have conducted a public interest test to determine whether the information should be released or withheld. The factors for this public interest have determined that whilst disclosure would demonstrate openness and transparency this is outweighed by the detrimental effect disclosure would have in revealing the capabilities of military operational planning by compromising the methodologies and practices employed in the gathering and analysis of information. I

have therefore concluded that the public interest supports withholding some information under Section 26.

All Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) cases remain open and if new evidence comes forward the PSNI will reinvestigate. Release of these documents must be carefully considered under Section 31 (Law Enforcement) of the FOI (A). I have completed this consideration through a public interest test including consultation with the PSNI who have advised that release of some of the information could adversely impact on any investigative process, and may jeopardise any future prosecutorial process. On this basis I am withholding some of the information under Section 31 of the FOI(A).

Some of the information falls within the scope of Section 38 (Health and Safety) of the FOI(A), as its release could endanger the physical or mental health of any individual or endanger the safety of any individual.

Section 38 (Health and Safety) is a qualified exemption and we have conducted a public interest test to determine whether the information should be released or withheld. The factors for this public interest have determined that whilst disclosure would demonstrate openness and transparency this is outweighed by the detrimental effect disclosure could have on those mentioned in the documents, or their family members and friends. I have concluded that whilst disclosure may be of historical interest, the health and safety of individuals must be taken into account. Some information has therefore been redacted under Section 38 of the FOI(A).

Additionally, some of the information contained within the disclosure constitutes personal information, such as names and addresses. Under FOI(A) this information is exempt under Section 40 (2) by reason of the first condition under Section 40 (3) (a) (i), as disclosure would contravene data protection principles under the Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA 2018). This is an absolute exemption and does not require a public interest test to be conducted in order for this information to be exempt from disclosure. Therefore, all personal information has been redacted.

I appreciate that this incident took place almost 50 years ago and the passage of time can be a factor in diminishing the applicability of exemptions to information. However, in this instance the passage of time is less relevant as the PSNI continue to investigate Troubles-related deaths and the overall balance is in favour of partial exemption.

OPINION/REASON-FOR-FAILURE- Evidence found at the scene of the explosion points to a directional mine comprising a milk churn, approx 40lbs coop and a topping of a large quantity of heavy metal shrapnel. The mine was laid in a path regularly used by SF. patrols in such a position that it could be used against a patrol as they scambled down a steep bank and over the stream. SAFO COMMENTS

A tragic incident reported in detail.



As it happened the first SF pass to use the path that day were Major STORRY, Battery Commander of 19 Ed Reg RA and his escort Cpl HOPE. The mine detonated after Cpl HOPE had passed it by several feet and whilst Major STORRY was virtually alongside it. Cpl HOPE was killed instantly and Major STORRY died of injuries after being taken to hospital.

It is considered that the mine was command wire initiated although no evidence of any means of initiation could be found. At the moment of detonation Cpl HOPE would have just become visible to someone watching the path from a westerly direction. [REDACTED]

It was several minutes before other S.F personnel appeared on the scene and a command wire could easily have been withdrawn.
