

# Introduction to the UK's Trade Remedies Authority (TRA)



# Who is the TRA?

The UK TRA is an Arms-Length Body of the Department for International Trade, set up through the Trade Act 2021 as a consequence of EU Exit.

The TRA has been set up to carry out a function previously carried out in the EU.

# What does the TRA do and why?

The TRA investigates allegations of unfair international trade practices which are harming UK producers, as well as unforeseen surges of imports. It does this to establish whether measures should be put in place to address the injury caused, normally in the form of duties.

The TRA makes independent, evidence-based decisions.

The TRA has full online guidance available to guide you through all parts of the trade remedies regime process <u>online</u>. There are also a number of factsheets relating to specific issues including on how to bring a case, how to interact with the TRA, and on the Investigations process.
