- (e) The products described above were derived from animals which were born and reared in the UK on or after 1 August 2001, the date from which the ban on the feeding of ruminant protein (other than milk) and mammalian meat/bone meal to ruminants in the EU is considered to have been effectively enforced;
- (f) The meat was derived from animals which received ante and postmortem inspection under veterinary supervision at the time of their slaughter and they were found to be fit for human consumption;

- (g) The animals from which the meat was derived were examined by an Official Veterinarian prior to slaughter for signs of a Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathy, with negative results;
- (h) Cattle from which the fresh meat and meat products destined for export originate were not subjected to a stunning process, prior to slaughter, with a device injecting compressed air or gas into the cranial cavity, or to a pithing process;
- All Specified Risk Material and tissues listed in Article
 11.4.14 of WOAH Terrestrial Animal Health Code have been removed from the carcase following slaughter and the products described above are not contaminates with such material/tissues.

The slaughterhouse(s), cutting/processing plant(s) and cold tores listed above are approved according to the UK legislation.

(k) The packaging of products referred above bears a UK/GB oval mark indicating that has been obtained handled and stored in accordance with UK regulations and continues to be fit for human consumption.
