I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the UKHO, and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found below:

Please specify the brand name for Boxxe

This is the contract for Microsoft Licensing, which is the supplier of our Virtualisation Software Platform Hyper-V and subsequently using Windows server as the OS. So the brand would be Microsoft.

Please specify the O/S for Insight

This is for storage, it uses its own Netapp proprietary firmware to operate, this is then used by the Virtualisation platform Hyper-V which is using Windows Server as the OS to store and access data. There is no OS to state for the storage array.

Please brief why the number of servers not available for all the contracts

We have provided the number of servers for the relevant category. We have 152 x HPe and 1 x Dell Physical servers and 1700 virtual servers running within our Hyper-V estate which are in the relevant columns for the requested category. There are no other servers under these categories.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance.
