## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: TASER HOLSTERS.

We refer to your email dated 13<sup>th</sup> April 2022 to the Ministry of Defence Police which was acknowledged on 14<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

Can any officers get different holsters approved as have seen some officers with thigh holsters some with high ride and drop legs?

A search for information has now been completed by the Ministry of Defence Police and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

Can any officers get different holsters approved as have seen some officers with thigh holsters some with high ride and drop legs?

No - MDP AFO-CT Officers are equipped with the MoD approved MDP RADAR CRAB Holster. This is the only holster approved by the force. The holster is worn with a drop leg support. An officer with a diagnosed medical condition can been issued with an adaptor to mount the holster on their belt as a tailored reasonable adjustment.
