## JUDGMENT

The claimant's application dated **17 December 2022** for reconsideration of the judgment sent to the parties on **6 December 2022** is refused.

## REASONS

- 1. There is no reasonable prospect of the original decision being varied or revoked.
- 2. The claimant's application for reconsideration does not highlight any perceived errors in the Judgment that could lead to a reconsideration. Rather, it focuses on conduct allegedly meted out against a client (referred to as "GF" in the Judgment sent to the parties on 6 December 2022) by the respondent.
- 3. The Tribunal is not the forum to conduct an inquiry of the nature the claimant is seeking. The Tribunal does not have jurisdiction to deal with the question as to whether GF's eviction was unlawful or discriminatory in nature. Nor, as explained to the claimant at the final hearing, can it determine any discrimination claim in which GF (not being an employee or worker of the respondent) is the alleged victim and the respondent the alleged perpetrator.
