Governance:

- The diversity of the Trust Board and the need to strengthen its education expertise at primary was discussed.
- This will be raised with the Trust and their plans to mitigate this through future recruitment.

Strategy:

- AB members questioned the distance of Port Isaac from the current schools within CELT.
- Assurances were given that CELT has taken this into consideration and agreed support for Port Isaac from another trust (Kernow Learning).
- CELT has a longer-term growth plan to establish a hub in this area to ensure small rural schools are not isolated.

• The improvement in the performance of schools within the Trust was positively referenced.

Trust Change

Points discussed in relation to academies moving to another trust.

Project: Whether to approve the following five academies from the Gatehouse Green Learning Trust, **Bristol** transferring to Excalibur Academies Trust.

Points raised in discussion:

Governance:

• The structure of the Trust Board and Members was commented on, and the overlap of governance tiers across trustees, members, and local governing bodies. This will be a condition of approval.

School Improvement:

- The school improvement plan for the merged Trusts and how this will develop and operate was discussed.
- The plan is based on every school having a specific action plan with overall accountability retained by the Trust CEO and Governors.
- It was confirmed that this would be subject to regular update with the Trust and the Regions Group team.
- The central team will see expansion under this merger and recruitment is already progressing with a primary academy improvement lead appointed. External consultants are currently engaged, and this will continue where there is a need identified.

Other:

• It was referenced that there will be increased demand on the CEO and they would benefit from a recommended mentor to support as the Trust expands.

RD decision: Approve with conditions.

Conditions:

- There should be no overlap between governance tiers in the new Trust, particularly:
 - Between local governing bodies and trustees
 - Between trustees and members

Project: Whether to approve Avanti Hall School, **Devon** transferring to Reach South Academy Trust.

Points raised in discussion:

Finance:

• An ESFA official provided assurances on the reserve position of Reach South. There is confidence in the financial control that the Trust has, and they have commissioned an SRMA to provide additional support. This will be subject to regular review with the ESFA.

School Improvement:

• The track record of school improvement across the Trust was discussed and the capacity to deliver by taking an additional school.

Strategy:

• The future growth strategy of Reach South was discussed. The Trust board has a clear vision and growth plan. This will be subject to review with the Trust and the Regions Group team to ensure growth is manageable.

Other:

- Questions were raised about the delivery of the school's ethos and characteristics, having previously been a Steiner school.
- It was confirmed that there has been a review of the curriculum by the current trust (Avanti). This is more aligned to the national curriculum than previously, but there are differences in line with the Avanti trust ethos.
- There was a discussion on the free school due to open in Exeter September 2023, and the impact, but the forecast for pupil places over the coming years shows there will be the demand for secondary places. Avanti Hall has had increasing first choice applications in recent years and provides additional choice for parents.
- It was confirmed that the incoming trust will actively engage with the school community in advance of transfer.
