## **Consultation on First Time Entrants (FTE) into the Criminal Justice System**

First time entrants into the Criminal Justice System data

- 1. The first time entrants statistics are published quarterly as part of the Criminal Justice Statistics collection, presenting key statistics on first time entrants.
- 2. This note is to consult users on our intention to **publish the first time** entrants statistics on an annual basis, rather than the current quarterly updates.
- 3. The data tables and data tool will be published on 18 May 2023 and annually, in May, from then on as part of the <u>First time entrants (FTE) into the Criminal Justice System and Offender Histories</u> publication. The May publication reports on the previous calendar year.
- 4. The documents affected by these changes will be be:
  - The first time entrants data tables
  - The first time entrants data tool

No other elements of Criminal Justice Statistics than those relating to first time entrants will be impacted.

- 5. This change is being made as the trends in this series do not change very much on a quarterly basis and there is limited user demand for this information on a quarterly basis.
