Consultation on First Time Entrants (FTE) into the Criminal Justice System

First time entrants into the Criminal Justice System data

1. The first time entrants statistics are published quarterly as part of the Criminal Justice Statistics collection, presenting key statistics on first time entrants.
2. This note is to consult users on our intention to **publish the first time entrants statistics on an annual basis, rather than the current quarterly updates.**
3. The data tables and data tool will be published on 18 May 2023 and annually, in May, from then on as part of the [First time entrants \(FTE\) into the Criminal Justice System and Offender Histories](#) publication. The May publication reports on the previous calendar year.
4. The documents affected by these changes will be be:
 - The first time entrants data tables
 - The first time entrants data tool

No other elements of Criminal Justice Statistics than those relating to first time entrants will be impacted.

5. This change is being made as the trends in this series do not change very much on a quarterly basis and there is limited user demand for this information on a quarterly basis.
