(7)II.4. Animal transport attestation

- I, the undersigned official veterinarian, further certify that the ratites are transported in crates or cages which:
 - (a) contain only ratites of the same species, category and type coming from the same establishment;
 - **(b)** bear the approval number of the establishment of origin;
 - (c) are closed in accordance with the instructions of the competent authority to avoid any possibility of substitution of the contents;
 - (d) in addition to the vehicles in which they are transported, are designed to:
 - prevent any excrement escaping and reduce to a minimum any loss of feathers during transport;
 - (ii) allow visual inspection of the ratites;
 - (iii) allow cleansing and disinfection;
 - have been cleansed and disinfected, as have the vehicles in which they are transported, before loading in accordance with the instructions of the competent authority

- (9) This guarantee is only required for breeding or productive ratites coming from countries, territories or zones with the entry 'X' in column 5 as set out in a document relating to 'poultry and poultry products' published on gov.uk, in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 798/2008.⁽¹⁰⁾
