# NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE, ENGLAND

# The General Medical Services Statement of Financial Entitlements (Amendment No. 2) Directions 2016

The Secretary of State for Health gives the following directions as to payments to be made under general medical services contracts in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 87, 272(7) and (8) and 273(1) of the National Health Service Act 2006(a).

The Secretary of State for Health has not consulted, in accordance with section 87(4) of that Act, with the body appearing to the Secretary of State to be representative of persons to whose remuneration these Directions relate. That body has agreed not to be consulted given that the changes introduced by these Directions are either not substantive in nature or relate to matters about which that body has previously been consulted.

#### Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) These Directions may be cited as the General Medical Services Statement of Financial Entitlements (Amendment) (No. 2) Directions 2016.
- (2) They come into force immediately after they are signed but have effect from 1st April 2016.

### Interpretation

**2.** In these Directions, "the principal Directions" means the General Medical Services Statement of Financial Entitlements Directions 2013(**b**).

#### Amendment of Section 12 of the principal Directions

**3.** In Section 12 of the principal Directions (rotavirus vaccine), in paragraph 12.3 (payment for administration of rotavirus vaccine), for "£7.64" substitute "£9.80".

# Amendment of Section 14B of the principal Directions

**5.** In Section 14B of the principal Directions (Hepatitis B vaccination for babies), in paragraph 14.B.2, for "£7.64" substitute "£9.80".

**6.** For the table in Annex I of the principal Directions (routine childhood vaccines and immunisations) substitute the following table.

Three years four months to five years old	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough) and polio (dTaP/IPV or DTaP/IPV)	One injection

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Thirteen to fourteen year olds	Meningococcal C containing vaccine	One injection
