The reasons for my objection are as follows:

The project is huge and overbearing. It will affect nature and residential and recreational amenities. 196 acres is not small. It will be the biggest solar farm in Uttlesford and one of the biggest in Essex. The visual impact will be huge and will not contribute to energy needs of local residents.

I'm a keen walker and everyday I walk with 2 equally keen neighbours. We walk on footpaths and bridle ways and we see lots of different birds including skylarks, yellow hammers, wagtails and red kites to name a few. We also see hares and deer. Everyday we say how lucky we are and how our lovely walks keep us sane. This will be ruined by this horrible development. Solar panels are NOT good for wildlife whatever the developers say.

There is also the loss of good farmland, something we are definitely going to need in the future This is an inappropriate industrial development in countryside. This will not enhance natural environment. Development is not compatible with Uttlesford policy S7 which states countryside will be protected for its own sake.
