further and in support of our email of 3/4/23 objecting to the aforementioned planning proposal, I attach 3 photos illustrating..

1...the steep incline up from Ickleton Road opposite 11 Elm Court and the overbearing effect it has on properties opposite the green field proposed development site. It is taken from a bedroom window and thus shows the impact on our lives in Elmdon.

2...A barn owl in flight from the wooded area, where the access road and tree felling is required, and across the green field site where the development is proposed.

3..A hare directly opposite our house.

These represent some of the wildlife I had previously mentioned (inclusive of buzzards, red kites, deer, kestrels) that are regular visitors to this area and I ask you to consider the above supporting our objection and ask why anyone would want to destroy, for ever, green space which is habitat loss, as David Attenborough quoted in his new program at the weekend " we are one of the most nature depleted countries in the world".

Why would people want to destroy even more wildlife habitat unnecessarily when there are urban areas suitable for development?
