This publication was withdrawn on 17 March 2023.

The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care gives the following Directions in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 253 and 272 of the National Health Service Act  $2006(\mathbf{a})$ .

#### Citation, commencement and application

**1.**—(1) These Directions may be cited as The Health Service and Social Care Workers (Scrutiny of Coronavirus-related Deaths) (Revocation) Directions 2022 and come into force on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

(2) These Directions are given to NHS Trusts.

## Interpretation

2. In these Directions, "NHS Trusts" means NHS Trusts and NHS foundation trusts in England.

## **Revocation of the 2020 Directions**

**3.**The Health Service and Social Care Workers (Scrutiny of Coronavirus-related Deaths) Directions 2020(**b**) are revoked.
