- How many officers/staff in your force have been arrested for breaching a nonmolestation order (NMO) from January 2019 to the end of December 2022?
- 2. How many officers/staff in your force have been arrested for breaching a sexual harm prevention order (SHPO) from January 2019 to the end of December 2022?
- 3. How many officers/staff in your force have been arrested for breaching a stalking protection order from January 2019 to the end of December 2022?

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that we do hold information in scope of your request.

How many officers/staff in your force have been arrested for breaching a non-molestation order (NMO) from January 2019 to the end of December 2022?
