- a) on (date) I examined the animal identified at paragraph I above and found it free from clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease and ectoparasites;

- g) African horse sickness, dourine and Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis have never occurred in Great Britain.



- ii. has been inspected and found to be free of contagious diseases and, insofar as can be determined, exposure thereto during the 60 days immediately preceding exportation;
- iii. has not to the best of my knowledge been vaccinated with a live, attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the 14 days immediately preceding exportation;
- iv. has not been on premises where either African Horse Sickness, Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis or vesicular stomatitis has occurred during the 60 days immediately preceding exportation;
- v. has not been on premises where dourine, glanders, epizootic lymphangitis, equine infectious anaemia or contagious equine metritis has occurred during the 60 days immediately preceding export;
- vi. has not, to the best of my knowledge, been on premises where surra, autochthonous equine piroplasmiasis or ulcerative lymphangitis has been recorded within 60 days immediately preceding export;
