| | <p>I, the undersigned official veterinarian, hereby certify that the animals herein described meet the following requirements:</p> <p>II.1. The animals were kept in government registered or licensed premises in the approved country or countries since birth</p> <p>II.2. The premises in the country of origin in which the animals were resident are under permanent veterinary supervision, and a health monitoring programme is followed including necropsies, microbiological and parasitological testing</p> <p>II.3. The animals were kept in captivity in the place of dispatch mentioned in box I.9. since birth or at least for six months before export</p> <p>II.4. The animals have not been resident in a holding or in contact with animals from a holding where a case of tuberculosis or other notifiable zoonoses including rabies occurred in the last 2 years</p> <p>II.5. The animals and the premises in which the animals reside were free of quarantine restrictions for 90 days prior to the scheduled date of export</p> | |

II.6. The animals were held in isolation for a minimum period of 30 days before export where they were isolated from animals that do not have the equivalent health status

II.7. The animals and all in-contact animals were free from clinical signs of infectious diseases during isolation

II.8. During isolation, the animals were treated twice for endoparasites. The treatments were at least 14 days apart.

II.10. ⁽¹⁾ In the case of gibbons and great apes: the animals were serologically tested for hepatitis on two occasions while in isolation, with an interval of 21–28 days between tests. Tests used were for detection of antibodies against hepatitis B core antigen and hepatitis B surface antigen and the results were negative

II.11. The animals were examined within 24 hours before loading at the place of origin, were free from clinical evidence of infectious or contagious diseases or external parasites and fit for transport

II.12. The animals will be transported in a manner which will minimize the risk of injury, damage to health or cruel treatment and in accordance with IATA requirements and/or CITES guidelines for transport where applicable

II.13. The vehicles, containers and all removable equipment for the transport of the animals were used for the first time or were cleaned and disinfected before loading

II.14. During transport to the place of loading and during transit to Switzerland the animals were not transported with animals that do not meet the criteria for export to Switzerland

II.15. The container was sealed with an official seal bearing the number indicated in box I.17.

The period of validity is 10 days.

- Box I.11.: Name of the city or place where the animals/products are loaded

- Box I.21.: Individual identification must be used
