Hello

I am writing to object to this again.

I have written twice already regarding this case and was relieved when it was rejected and also lost its appeal.

Having an open logistics facility in a village is wholly inappropriate and not in keeping with the character of the local area.

There is only one access to the facility down a country lane. There is a low bridge to the right of the site that trucks cannot get under. We already have problems with trucks getting stuck there. There is no pavement on the lane making it more dangerous for pedestrians, dog walkers. It will also be unsafe for the many cyclists in the area.

The intense traffic on the lane will be excessive bringing with it noise, pollution and associated smells at all hours of the day and night.

They have already taken down trees and affected the local wildlife and will likely have further detrimental impact on the wildlife.

There is a listed building by the roadside which may be damaged with the amount of rumbling the lorries will cause.
