PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about Poultry statistics which the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) received on 18 January 2023. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000.

The information you requested and the response is detailed below:

“Please can you send to me the latest figure for the ‘total number of registered keepers of poultry’ in GB and/or UK.”

The total number of registered keepers of poultry in GB as of 24th January 2023 is 57,560.

The figure is based on Chicken, Duck, Goose, Guinea Fowl, Ostrich, Partridges, Pheasant, Quail, Turkey, Rhea and Pigeon (meat).

It is only compulsory to register flocks of poultry of over 50 birds with APHA. Owners/Keepers can voluntarily register flocks of less than 50 birds. To find out more about the registration of birds visit the GOV.Uk website for information here:

The information provided are the livestock keepers upon registration. As part of the registration process, APHA ask the keeper what their usual stock numbers are, and this is recorded in the APHA database. It is the responsibility of the owner/keeper to keep APHA informed of any number changes.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOI and the government’s Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with
