- 3. The claimant's claim of breach of contract regarding notice pay is well founded.
- 4. The claimant is awarded damages for breach of contract as per paragraph 3 in the sum of £16,693.62;
- 5. The claimant is awarded compensation arising from the discrimination and victimisation as per paragraphs 1 and 2 as follows:
  - A sum equivalent to loss of earning for 8 weeks (from the end of her notice period to the commencement of new employment) of £8,988.78; and
  - b. An award for injury to feelings in the sum of £15,000.
