Thank you for your email of 24 March 2023 clarifying your Freedom of Information request of 27 February 2023. You have requested the following information:

"Please can you provide information on members of civinlan staff who work at the MOD and members of the armed forces who have the following medical codrations:

- Autism
- ADHD
- Dyspraxia
- Dyslexia

Can you please also inculd members of the minstyr of defence police."

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I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

Information on conditions of MOD civilian staff, which includes Ministry of Defence Police, is not held on MyHR, the MOD Human Resources system. However, the data for Military personnel is held and can be found below:

As at 1 February 2023:

- 433 currently serving UK armed forces personnel had at least one Read code for Autism entered into their electronic medical record.
- 1,674 currently serving UK armed forces personnel had at least one Read code for ADHD entered into their electronic medical record.
- 632 currently serving UK armed forces personnel had at least one Read code for Dyslexia entered into their electronic medical record.
- 206 currently serving UK armed forces personnel had at least one Read code for Dyspraxia entered into their electronic medical record.

Under Section 16 of the FOI (Help and Assistance) you may find it useful to note:

The figures provided in this response are for all UK armed forces trained and untrained, regular and reservist personnel in service as at 1 February 2022. This does not include entitled or non-entitled civilians, foreign service or non-UK military.

Please note that the majority of reservist personnel receive their primary medical care from the NHS. Any personnel who were only seen by the NHS regarding these conditions and have not informed the MOD were not included in the figures presented for the number of personnel with a Read code entered into their military medical record.

Information was derived from the Defence Medical Information Capability Programme (DMICP). DMICP has a centralised data warehouse of Read coded information. It is the source of electronic, integrated healthcare records for primary healthcare and some MOD specialist care providers from which searches can be run.

Only information that is Read coded is available for electronic searches. To identify text or scanned information would require an individual review of each patient record. DMICP is a live data source and is subject to change. Date of extract: 7 March 2023.

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Joint Personnel Administration (JPA) is the most accurate source of demographic information for UK Armed Forces personnel and was used to gather information on when an individual was serving.

With regard to civilian personnel, as previously advised in the letter of 24 March 2023, MyHR only records disabilities broken down to the following categories:

Hearing Learning or concentrating or remembering Mental Health Mobility Other barriers Social or behavioural issues Stamina or breathing difficulty Vision

Under Section 16 of the FOI Act (Help and Assistance) you may wish to know that it is not mandatory for civilian staff to disclose any neurodiverse conditions if they do not wish to do so. However, if they would like to access additional help, a Workplace Adjustment Passport, designed to capture all requirements for workplace adjustments, both physical and non-physical can be requested. The Workplace Adjustment Passport is being adopted across all government departments with the aim of making it easier for people with disabilities to move between departments. Completion of the passport is voluntary; therefore, the employee retains full ownership and complete control over the content.

Please note that any request for an internal review should be made within 40 working days of the date of this response.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may raise your complaint directly to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
