EXPORT OF GUINEA PIGS, HAMSTERS, RATS, MICE AND GERBIL FROM GREAT BRITAIN TO MEXICO

HEALTH CERTIFICATE - NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN AND EXPORTER

1. SCOPE OF THE CERTIFICATE

Export health certificate 6058EHC may be used for the export of guinea pigs, hamsters, rats, mice and gerbil from Great Britain to Mexico.

2. CERTIFICATION BY AN OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN (OV)

This certificate may be signed by an OV appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, Scottish Executive Environment and Rural Affairs Department or National Assembly For Wales who is on the appropriate panel for export purposes. OVs should affix the OV stamp to the certificate in the normal manner.

The health certificate must be signed and stamped with LVI stamp in any ink colour ${f OTHER\ THAN\ BLACK}$.

A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the local Divisional Veterinary Manager on the day of issue.

3. POST IMPORT CONDITIONS

The importer in Mexico is required to submit a letter to the Direccion General de Salud Animal, signed by the responsible veterinarian at the importing laboratory, undertaking to notify the Direccion General immediately if any change is observed in the health status of the imported animals within 30 days of their arrival.

4. **DISCLAIMER**

The Departmental disclaimer (Form 372DMR) will be issued to the exporter with this certificate for his/her information. The certificate is provided on the basis of information available at the time and may not necessarily comply fully with the requirements of the importing country. It is the exporter's responsibility to check the certificate against any relevant import permit or any advice provided by the competent authority in the importing country. If these do not match, the exporter should contact the live animal export section of the International Trade Unit at 1A Page Street, London SW1P 4PQ, Tel 0207 904 6343, Fax 0207 904 6428.

5. WELFARE AND TRANSPORTATION
