Thank you for your email of 3 May 2023 to the Ministry of Defence (MOD) requesting the following information:

- 1. The number of private-sector contractors who held the following security clearances issued by the Defence Business Services National Security Vetting (part of DBS) in 2017:
- a) Developed Vetting
- b) Enhanced Developed Vetting
- 2. The number of private-sector contractors who held the following security clearances issued by the Defence Business Services National Security Vetting in 2013:
- a) Developed Vetting
- b) Enhanced Developed Vetting

By private-sector contractors, I refer to individuals who are not UK government employees but provide services to the government as contractors or part of a contracting arrangement.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the MOD and I can confirm that no information in scope of your request is held.

Under Section 16 of the FOIA (Information and Assistance) you may wish to be aware that ownership of United Kingdom Security Vetting (UKSV) transferred from the MOD to the Cabinet Office in April 2020.
