Defra attended the South RFG online meeting in May to answer your questions and explained that this round is a trial, and further rounds may open to trawl vessels.

Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA) seafarers medical Q&A

At the previous RFG meeting, Laurance Capstick attended to answer your MCA related queries. This meeting focused on the upcoming medical requirements. We've included some quick Q&A answers below.

What happens if a fisher does not pass the medical?

This depends on the medical assessment for example if it is the ML5 they may get a referral to a specialist.

Can a personal doctor be used?

For the ENG1 this must be done by an MCA approved doctor. The ML5 can be done by any registered doctor.

What happens when the Grandfather rights are no longer available?

Grandfather rights will be carried forward into the subsequent years; if you apply for the Grandfather rights before the 30th November 2023 you will be eligible.
