LEGALISATION OF UK DOCUMENTS FOR USE IN VIETNAM

Effective from 13 November 2017

Legalisation is the official confirmation that a signature, seal or stamp on an official public document is genuine. To get a UK document legalised for use in Vietnam, the documents must be legalised through the following process:

Step 1 - Legalised by FCDO Legalisation Office, UK

Please <u>apply online for legalisation service</u> by the Legalisation Office in the UK. Your document may require certification by a UK Solicitor or Notary Public before it can be legalised.

Step 2 – Legalised by the Vietnamese Embassy in London, UK

Please <u>visit the website of the Vietnamese Embassy and contact this office</u> for further advice about the cost and postal arrangement.

Notice

- You can either do this yourself or employ a commercial provider to do it on your behalf. For more information on commercial providers, please search online and use keywords "legalising documents for Vietnam".
- Your document would not be recognised in Vietnam if you do not complete **Step 2**.
- There is no requirement for the British Embassy in Hanoi or the Consulate General in Ho Chi Minh City to view or stamp these documents once they have been legalised by the Vietnamese Embassy in London.
