Animal Gatherings Order 2010 - England and Wales (as amended) (hereafter referred to as 'the legislation')

Schedule of Conditions

1. General Conditions

- a) The licensee must ensure that:
 - i) the schedule of conditions on the licence are complied with
 - ii) a Disease Control Contingency Plan will be available on site containing at least the information contained in the document AGO04

- iii) contingency plan/s will also be in place to cover: an inability to clean and disinfect the site (if paved), a failure of the electronic ear tag reading system if used, animal welfare incidents at the gathering
- iv) an up to date list of contacts will be available and visible on site during a gathering: to include telephone numbers for APHA, Local Authority (LA), licensee and biosecurity officer
- b) The licensee must appoint a biosecurity officer (who may be the named licensee) to monitor compliance with the licence and with the legislation.
- c) The licensee must take all reasonable steps to prevent the spread of disease on to, within, and off the licensed premises during animal gatherings.
- d) The licensee must ensure that animals do not enter or leave the animal area except on a vehicle and that animals are unloaded from, and loaded onto, vehicles only in the animal area.
- e) The licensee must erect and maintain a stock proof fence around the licensed premises.
- f) The licensee must notify the times when the licenced premises will be used as an animal gathering to the LA and APHA giving at least 14 days' notice.
- g) The licenses must ensure that all equipment to which animals have had access must be cleansed of visible contamination and then disinfected with an approved disinfectant after the last animal has left and before the next gathering.
- h) The licensee must not allow an animal gathering to take place until 27 days has elapsed from the day the last animal left the licensed premises previously (condition 6 below) unless the animal area is paved and capable of disinfection and has been cleansed and disinfected since the last animal left previously (condition 4).

2. Staff engaged in the animal area

The licensee must ensure that:

a) The following records are kept at the licensed premises to allow tracing in the event of a suspect case of

notifiable disease at the premises:

- i) names and addresses of all staff who work in the animal area, and
- ii) information on their regular contact with farm livestock other than at the licensed premises,
- b) The records are kept up to date, and
- c) The records are kept for six months.

3. Operations on any day on which an animal gathering occurs

The licensee must ensure that sufficient records are kept to enable the tracing of animals and livestock vehicles. These records are to be retained for six months and must be produced when required to do so by an authorised officer.

4. Facilities at licensed premises where there is one or more paved animal area that is capable of being cleansed and disinfected

a) the floor of the paved animal area(s) and all fixtures and fittings in these animal area(s) are in a good state of repair such that they remain capable of being cleansed and disinfected in accordance with the Animal Gatherings Order 2010 and are cleansed and disinfected so between gatherings.

b) there is a discrete area for cleansing and disinfection of vehicles that have been used for transporting animals that is provided with an approved disinfectant on the day(s) of each gathering. This area is itself capable of being cleansed and disinfected and is cleansed and disinfected after each gathering.

c) any vehicle whose wheels have been contaminated by driving within the area used by animals must have the wheels, wheel arches and mudguards of the whole vehicle (including towing vehicle) cleaned and disinfected before the vehicle leaves the gathering.

5. Facilities at licensed premises where more than one animal area is used

The licensee must ensure that if it is necessary to walk animals between any of the animal areas, the areas must be:

i) adjoining, or

ii) connected by designated walkways.

6. Facilities and procedures at licensed premises where there is one or more unpaved animal areas that is not capable of being cleansed and disinfected

No person may allow an animal gathering to take place on unpaved animal areas until 27 days has elapsed from the day on which the last animal has left the unpaved area and all equipment to which animals have had access has been cleaned and disinfected.

7. Disposal of bedding and animal excreta

The licensee must ensure that all bedding and animal excreta are either: a) destroyed.

- b) treated so as to remove the risk of transmission of disease, or
- c) disposed of so that animals do not have access to them.

A record will be kept of how these materials have been disposed of.

Notes for Information (These do not form part of the licence conditions)

- It is an offence to hold an animal gathering for the purpose of sale, including show or exhibition (if any), or for onward consignment within GB without a licence issued by a Veterinary Inspector.
- It is a requirement of the Welfare of Animals at Markets Order 1990 (as amended) that 'no person shall permit an unfit animal to be exposed for sale in a market'. The definition of 'unfit' includes 'diseased'.
- All words and phrases used in the licence shall bear the meaning they bear in the Animal Health Act 1981 and the Animal Gatherings (England) Order 2010/Animal Gatherings (Wales) Order 2010 unless otherwise defined or the context otherwise requires.
- Failure to comply with the conditions of the licence is an offence under the Animal Health Act 1981 and the Animal Gatherings (England) Order 2010/Animal Gatherings (Wales) Order 2010 and may render a person liable to prosecution and heavy penalties on conviction.
- In addition, breaches of the provisions of the licence or the Animal Gatherings (England) Order 2010/Animal Gatherings (Wales) Order 2010 may lead to the licence being suspended, made subject to additional conditions or being revoked without further notice.

Failure to observe the measures required in this licence is an offence under Section 73 of the Animal Health Act 1981. The penalty on conviction of an offence under this section is a maximum of six months imprisonment and/or an unlimited fine.
