RE: Request for Information – RFI4344

Thank you for your request for information which was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You requested the following information:

London Great West Towers Mega City, site stretching in a wide band and following the River Brent from Brent Cross down to Brentford across borough boundaries.

Public transport investment justifying car-free towers is understood, but overall what is Homes England doing to date to enable high quality active travel (walking and cycling) and linkages in rather than segregations from strong protected resilience building conservation areas adjacent to this new across borough boundaries as yet un-coordinated new London Mega City on sites building?

A fast safe cycle superhighway Wembley to Richmond, Harlesden to Westfield through car-free towered homes. New towers seem to be blocking that human possibility up? The Mayor wants 80% of journeys to be sustainable by 2041/ ULEZ arriving August 2023?
