

An Act for repairing and keeping in Repair the Pier and Harbour of Ilfordcombe, in the County of Devon.



Darbour, which contains Eight hundred fifty and fix feet in Length, or thereabouts, and about Forty two feet in Peight, and the Marp-house, Light-house, and Olot-boats, and Taw-boats belonging to the said abe constantly been repaired and maintained at the legister of the Ancestors of Six Bourchier design, without any Asstance, except only some small knowledgments which have been paid to them, as Lords

Lords of the said Manor of Ilfordcombe: And where, as by Length of Time, and Asolence of the Sea, the Rey of Pier of the Port of Parbour afore. faid is very much funk and decayed, the Warp and Clarp house by long Asage gone to Decay, and the Light-house, and the said Boats for Piloting and Tawing of Messels very much out of Repair, to the great Prejudice of his Pajesty's Rebenue, and the Trade of the said Town of Ilfordcombe, and Parts adjacent; so that unless some speedy Care be taken to repair the said Rep oz Pier, Light-house, Warphouse, and Boats for Piloting and Tawing of Cessels. the said Parbour will become useless to the Kingdom, and dangerous to Mavigation, and the Charges of repairing and maintaining the same will be too great to be boan by the said Sir Bourchier Wrey and his heirs, although the ancient Duties and Acknowledgments hould be duly paid and answered; which of late Pears have been much funk and loft, for want of a Power to recover the same: Be it therefore enaded by the King's most Ercellent Pajetty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the Twenty fourth Day of June, which shall be in the Pear of our Lord One thousand seven hundzed and thirty one, the several Sums, Duties, and Acknowledgments following, thall be paid to the said Sir Bourchier Wrey, his Peirs, and Amgns, Lords of the said Panor, for the Purpoles afozesaid (all or the greatest Part of which Duties, Sums, and Acknowledgments were anciently paid to the Lozds of the said Panoz foz the same) that is to lay,

Toll for Wool-

For all Woollen and Bay Parn, and Flocks, One len Goods, &c. half penny per Stone, each to contain Eighteen Pounds, to be paid by the Werchant, or other Person, in whose Custody or Possession, or by whose Order the said Goods or Merchandises thall be delivered, to be weighed by the proper Officer thereunto appointed; and for every Tun of all other Goods and Berchandise whatsoever, which thall be imported and landed, or discharged out of any Ship or Aessel in the said Port of Ilfordcombe, or which thall be exported and carried out of the fair Port by Water, the Sum of Eight Pence, to be paid by every Waster of other Person taking Charge of at ny Ship, Hoy, Bark, of Aestel, that shall take on 180ard.

Board the same, by Way of Average.

and for every Ship or Aestel that pays Reclare, there thall be paid by the said Paster, or other Perion taking Care and Charge of the same, over and above the sato Duties of Reelage, the Sum of Six Pence for each Top, which such Mestel beareth.

and for the Reelage of every Boat belonging to any other Port or Place, the Sum of Four Pence, to

be paid by the Waster thereof.

ties, and such Divers observed, as follows;

First, The Owner of such Taw Boat Hall have for going of coming to of from any Ship of Heffel Three Shares, and also the Owner of the said Boat and Company thall have One third of every Pilot Ship, the Owner of such Boat to have his or her Part, whether the Pilot be hipped within the said harbour, oz with out; and also the Reeper of Person having the Care of such Boat, shall have one Pan's Share; and that no Boat thall ferve, but such Taw Boat only, which is to attend the Place; and if any other Boat hall serve, the Owner of Reeper of such Boat so serving, Mall fozfeit and pay foz every Offence, Sir Shillings and eight Pence, unless upon special Occasion and Extremity of Weather; then the Owner or Reeper of the Taw Boat, or his Deputy, chall appoint such o ther Boats to allist him, as he shall think fit; and the Owner or Reeper of such Taw Boat shall have and recover from every such special Boat One Share, and that the Keeper of the said Taw Boat thall ap
