I, the undersigned, certify that the birds described above meet the following requirements:

- a) The premises of origin are free from highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) for the past ninety (90) days prior to export;
- b) The area within 3 km radius around the premises of origin are free from highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) for the past ninety (90) days prior to export;
- c) The premises of origin have been free from velogenic Newcastle disease for the past six (6) months prior to export;
- d) The birds have not been vaccinated against avian influenza disease;
- e) The birds have been kept at the premises of origin and showed no clinical of infectious and contagious disease;
- f) The birds have been examined on the day of export and found to be free from any clinical signs of infectious and contagious diseases;
- g) The boxes or containers in which the birds are to be accommodated for export to Thailand comply with the International Air Transport Association (IATA) specifications, particularly in relation to height, perch space and ventilation, and with adequate access for feeding and watering.
