# **JUDGMENT**

### **Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 21**

- 1. The claimant was dismissed by reason of redundancy and is entitled to a redundancy payment of £3819.08.
- 2. It was not reasonably practicable for the claimant to issue the claim within three months of termination of employment. The claimant issued the claim within a reasonable time thereafter.
- 3. The claimant's claim for unfair dismissal succeeds. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant a compensatory award in the net sum of £2523.66 and an amount for loss of statutory rights in the sum of £500.00.
- 4. The claimant was dismissed in breach of contract in respect of notice and the respondent is ordered to pay damages to the claimant in the net sum of £1922.50.
- 5. The respondent has failed to pay the claimant's holiday entitlement and is ordered to pay the claimant the net sum of £1140.68.
- 6. The respondent was in breach of the duty under section 1 Employment Rights Act 1996, to give a written statement of initial employment particulars. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the sum of £2036.84.
- 7. The Employment Protection (Recoupment of Jobseeker's Allowance and

Income Support) Regulations 1996 apply to this award.
