

Claiming the Evidence Provision Fee

Purpose and background

The Evidence Provision Fee (EPF) was introduced as part of the implementation of the Crown Court Means Testing (CCMT) scheme. Information on the scheme and how it works can be found in the Crown Court Fee Guidance.

Claiming the EPF

To claim the EPF on CCCD, tick the box in the Miscellaneous fee section.

CCD does not currently calculate the fee, so you must enter this manually, whether you are claiming the lower or upper tier fee. You need to enter either £45 or £90.

However, there is an option for a link to be created between CCD and your internal case management system, which will automatically transfer a case from your case management system into CCD as a draft.
