Guidance

Manner of Cleansing and Disinfection

1. The (parts of the) premises, facilities, vehicle(s) or equipment referred to are required to be

cleansed and disinfected in the manner described below:

- before the removal of manure from the parts of the buildings specified, they shall be sprayed or saturated with an approved disinfectant
- the disinfectant used must be approved for use against Tuberculosis under The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (England) Order 2007 / The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Scotland) Order 2008 (as amended) / The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Wales) Order 2007 (as amended) and applied in accordance with the requirements of such approval, particularly the dilution rate. Every receptacle containing an approved disinfectant which is placed on sale or delivered to a purchaser must bear a label containing a citation of the approval, including the dilution rate at which the disinfectant is to be used for TB Control purposes

- manure shall then be removed from the specified parts and stacked for at least three weeks in a place that is inaccessible to farm animals where it will either be treated with a suitable disinfectant or covered with a layer of uninfected manure or earth. It is strongly recommended that this manure is not spread on pasture land, or that cattle do not graze pasture land for 60 days following the application of manure from TB reactor cattle. Liquid waste from sheds and other quarters used by the animals must be disinfected if it is not collected at the same time as the manure
- after the removal of the manure, the equipment used and the specified parts shall be thoroughly scraped, the scrapings shall be removed and the equipment and specified parts shall then be cleansed and washed thoroughly taking care not to create aerosols and finally, coated with an approved disinfectant
- all articles used for the animals to which this Notice relates shall be thoroughly cleansed and washed in such other manner as may be approved in writing by the Secretary of State/Scottish Ministers/Welsh Ministers
- the fields, pasture and other land grazed or used by infected cattle in farms affected by a TB breakdown should be left de-stocked and not grazed by livestock for a minimum period of 60 days after removal of the last reactor or contact. This is to allow for the natural die-off, decay and inactivation of any bovine TB bacteria that may have contaminated the environment
- the protective clothing worn by the persons who have carried out the disinfection shall be washed in an approved disinfectant.

Notes

1. Under the Tuberculosis Orders it is an offence if the owner or other person in charge of the herd fails to cleanse and disinfect buildings, vehicles, plant or equipment as required by this Notice and in the manner described. The Orders further provide that if a person on whom this Notice is served fails to comply with its requirements, then the appropriate Department may arrange for the necessary cleansing and disinfection and recover the costs from the person in default.

2. Particular regard should be paid to the instructions accompanying the disinfectant, including health and safety warnings, and to the avoidance of tainting milk.
