- (a) has/have been identified in accordance with GB legislation and in such a way that the original holding, centre or organisation can be traced,
- (b) has/have been subjected today, within 48 hours prior to the date of dispatch, to a clinical inspection and do not show any clinical signs of disease,
- (c) has/have been isolated from other birds that do not have the same health status and kept continuously in a bio-secure establishment, for at least 30 days prior to and until the date of dispatch, and
- (d) were sampled 7 to 14 days prior to shipment, with both oropharyngeal and cloacal swabs taken on [dd/mm/yyyy], and at least 48 hours after the start of isolation as per Point (c) in accordance with GB requirements;

AH/A361 Animal transport (Transport and storage)

I have received written confirmation from the owner or their appointed agent that the birds will be transported in new containers or containers suitable for and that have been cleansed and disinfected satisfactorily as inspected by me on this day. The disinfection used, (name) is officially recognised as effective against viruses, and the recommended contact time of the disinfectant was observed.
