1. Welcome and apologies

The Chair welcomed attendees, apologies are recorded in Annex A.

2. CSA Update

The Deputy Chief Scientific Advisor (DCSA) provided updates on the following:

- negotiations are continuing between the United Kingdom (UK) and the European Union (EU) on reassociation of Horizon and it remains the UK's position that we hope to reassociate on fair and reasonable terms.
- On Europe Day the EU ambassadors wrote a letter to The Guardian in which they stated that they would welcome a much closer relationship with the UK after the <u>Windsor framework</u>.
- Retained EU law (REUL) continues to be a moving target in government and Defra are monitoring this closely to see how and when the best time would be to engage SAC again on this subject.

3. Systems Work on Land Use

Land use is a complex issue with significant implications for the government's goals on food, biodiversity, water, air, climate, rural development, and housing. Defra's Systems Research team is applying systems thinking principles and approach to land use policy to help the department embed systems thinking into policy and evidence., The team recently met with the SAC to discuss progress and seek expert steer on future priorities.

The SAC discussed possible ways of testing systems research insights with cohorts of stakeholders in specific sub-systems. They also explored ideas for making use of more complex simulation models. SAC agreed with the importance of building trust with key stakeholders and designing long-term strategies to build trusted relationships.

On future direction, the SAC felt that all areas of Defra's work have significant complexity, and that particularly water, chemicals, and pollution could benefit from systems thinking to assess intervention points and unintended consequences. They also suggested considering systems research to optimize food security with land use change, and to assess the impact of offshoring emissions and other outcomes of the food system.
