- (c) in the 60 days before consignment was not in contact with poultry which does not fulfil the conditions in (a) and (b); and
- (d) were kept in isolation under official surveillance on the establishment of origin during the 14 days mentioned in (b).

Please note that according to Regulation No 1/2005 animals will be checked by the competent authorities if they are fit to continue the journey after entry into Great Britain. In the case the requirements are not fulfilled, the animals need to be unloaded and further measures taken.
