- (b) underwent a virus isolation test for Newcastle disease, carried out in an official laboratory 7 to 10 days after their entry into isolation on either cloacal swabs or faeces samples from each bird and in which no avian paramyxovirus type 1 isolates with an intracerebral Pathogenicity Index (ICPI) of more than 0.4 were found. Favourable results were available for all tests carried out before the day-old chicks left the hatchery for import to Great Britain;
- (c) during the last 30 days prior to and during laying of the hatching eggs from which the day-old chicks for import to Great Britain are derived, have not been in contact with poultry (including ratites) which do not fulfil the guarantees mentioned under (a), (b) and (d);
- (d) come from flocks in which surveillance for Newcastle disease has been carried out under a statistically based sampling plan which produced negative results for at least six months immediately prior to import to Great Britain.
