Thank you for your email received by the Ministry Of Defence on 31/05/2023 requesting the following information:

"FOI request about photographers used by the department in 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22, 2022/23 and spending so far in 2023/2024. Could I have the figures broken down by financial year to show:

- a) How much money was spent by the department on using photographers?
- b) How many photographers the department employs? If it employs zero directly, could it be indicated where the photographers come from i.e. are they part of a pool of civil service photographers that the department can make use of? Are they freelancers hired for the occasion?
- c) Stated whether the photographers are civil servants or treated as special advisers.
- d) The salary band for the photographers.
- e) Whether they are full-time, part-time or freelance."

We are treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

We have now completed a search for the information you requested, and I can confirm that most of the information in scope of your request is held and has been provided in this response.

Information in scope of the request is held however part of the information falls within the scope of absolute and qualified exemptions provided under section 21 (information accessible by other means) and section 40 (personal information) of the FOIA. We can provide the number of photographers by military rank, civilian grades and the Future Reserve Photographers by Service and NATO Rank as shown in the tables below.

Please note there is no special pay band for photographers. They are treated as regular personnel on the Main Pay Scale for all three services where pay rates are based on the individual's Rank. Service does not determine the pay rate of a photographer for the Military. All photographers fall under Other Ranks. Under section 21, a breakdown of military salaries for all Other Ranks is in the public domain as part of Quarterly Service Personnel (SPS) Official Statistic publication. Section 40(2) has been applied to some of the information to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018 and GDPR. In addition, in line with JSP200 Statistics Disclosure Guidance, numbers fewer than five have been suppressed to reduce the possible inadvertent disclosure of individual identities; secondary suppression has been applied so numbers cannot be derived. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.
