Please see the table below containing the number of accounts that are in arrears on interest payments on their Help to Buy Equity Loan. For the current calendar year, we are able to provide information up until the end of July 2023. We are not able to provide information on the number of 'people' who are in arrears

We recognise that there has been an increase in the number of accounts that are in arrears, we consider that this is attributable to the current economic climate and is in line with comparable industry statistics for the same period.
