| | The Phase 1 Project update was provided by PG (HS2), showing progress on enabling works, main works & station contracts. | | | |
| | EL (NWBC) mentioned the movement of a conveyor at Water Orton and reiterated the need for pre-application engagement to ensure the LPAs are made aware of any significant construction updates. PG (HS2) noted that the respective HS2 planning manager will liaise with EL on this matter. | | | HS2 |

| | MD (HS2) presented charts showing the time taken to determine the main works Schedule 17 applications in the last six months. MD noted performance is broadly similar to previous months. | | | |
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| | MD (HS2) also presented charts showing Schedule 17 applications currently awaiting determination. These show a higher proportion of applications in the 8-16 week determination period however the statistics weren't raising major concerns at this present time. | |
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| | MD (HS2) also shared a chart showing actual numbers of Schedule 17 submissions vs. planned submissions shown in quarterly forward plans. MD (HS2) noted that HS2 are seeking to issue forward plans more regularly that every 3 months to give greater clarity on the planned numbers of submissions. | |
| | MD (HS2) presented an update on the status of appeals, with 4 live appeals. | |
| | TA (Chair) requested feedback via email from LPA's that the request for a Sch17 workflow process was being acted upon. | LPAs |
| 5. | Local Authority Feedback and Issues Arising | |
| | DW (WNC) noted that LPAs appreciate the time constraints contractors are under however indicated that in some instances, key information is being provided to planning officers late in the process. MD (HS2) noted that the HS2 planning team will be considering the concerns raised by DW. | |
| | JS (SMBC) reiterated the same concerns that at times there are delays in information coming back to planning officers were requested following an initial pre-application discussion. | |
| | GK (Bucks C) highlighted that transparency on the schedule for submissions would assist LPA's so that pre-application engagement can be best practice driven as well as being schedule driven. | |
| | TA (Chair) raised a suggestion for HS2 contractors to prepare a list of questions to be provided to LPA's which could provide feedback on the perceived strengths and weaknesses of contractors with a view of identifying areas of potential improvement. PG (HS2) questioned whether TA could facilitate an exercise for both sides to provide feedback on performance. HS2 to canvas opinion on the approach from contractors. | HS2 |
| | VC (BCC) raised the need for written statements with pre-application submission and Sch17 submissions. Currently the statements are missing a description of what the LPA is being asked to assess against Sch17 of the Act and how HS2 have assessed the submission against the relevant parts of the Act. VC queried whether PFN3 may need amending. MD (HS2) appreciated the suggestion and would look into what guidance could be provided to contractors. DW (WNC) further queried how EIA regulations are covered in the written statement and requested that further information is required to demonstrate that Sch17 applications respond to the EIA regulations or identify what further information is required to demonstrate that EIA regulations are | HS2 |

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| 6. | Common Design Elements and Design Approaches Update | |
| | WM (HS2) provided an update on CDE's noting that draft Planning Forum Note (PFN) 16a, 16b and 18 have been circulated. | |
| | WM described the content of draft PFN 18 regarding lineside noise barriers with a concealed post barrier and exposed post barrier. WM reiterated that a CDE has not been pursued for lineside noise barriers. | |
| | TJ (Bucks C) noted their presumption in favour of the concealed post option. JF (HCC) queried who would be erecting the noise barriers. WM (HS2) confirmed the main works contractors would be responsible for constructing noise barriers. | |
| | DW (WNC) questioned the approach to inserting a crank on an exposed post barrier. WM (HS2) noted that generally a crank on exposed post barrier is not being considered given that the locations for exposed post barriers are more rural and should not require a crank. However, should it be required, it would be designed in a similar way to the concealed post. Any gaps between the cranked elements would be very narrow and not affect the performance on noise mitigation unless the receptor is immediately adjacent to the barrier. In such instances, gaps could be filled if required following acoustic testing. MD (HS2) noted that this can be clarified in the draft PFN18. | HS2 |
| | WM (HS2) confirmed that the noise barriers will transition in height where appropriate. The heights of the barriers will range from 2m to 6m from ground level. HS2 to add a diagram to the PFN to demonstrate the heights from ground level and top of rail. | HS2 |
| | Para 2.1.2 of draft PFN 16a requires amending. HS2 to action. DW (WNC) queries the clarity of this paragraph referring to occasions where road overbridged may use the CDE described in PFN16a rather than the amended road overbridge parapet described in PFN 16b. WM (HS2) noted that this section can be revisited and wording possibly withdrawn. HS2 to provide an update to the PFN. | HS2 |
| | WM presented the changes to road overbridge parapets as a result of the additional safety measures to be designed for. WM mentioned that a session has been set up to discuss the approach to green verges. Noted that the principle of the PFN's does not go into detailed dimensions of green verges which can be discussed separately. | |
| | TJ (Bucks C) raised a request to explore to development of a cross section for green verges to support future applications. | |
| | TA (Chair) summarized that there were no challenges to the two types of noise | HS2 |

| | barrier and that testing of the barriers could commence. Clarifications to the draft PFN's as noted above are to be addressed by HS2 and re-issued to Planning Forum with a view to be signed off at the September Planning Forum. TA (Chair) noted that with regard to the parapets PFN, the green verge issue required further discussion to be taken up as part of the Design sub-group. HS2 to confirm a date for further discussion on the point. An update on the fencing design approach is to be provided at the September Planning Forum. TA (Chair) noted that the fencing design is a voluntary discussion between HS2 and LPAs and the design of fences is not an item for approval through a Sch 17 application, only the position of fences is for determination. DS (HS2) noted that an update on the signage strategy is to be provided at the September Planning Forum. | HS2 |
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| 7. | Community Engagement | |
| | VB (HS2) noted that approximately 10,500 enquiries have been received route wide in the year to June to date with 92% of those enquiries acknowledged within 2 working days. Around 62% of enquiries are resolved by the helpdesk at the first point of contact. 38% require referral to technical specialists or the supply chain. Of those around 72% are resolved within 2 working days. In terms of the new KPI relating to urgent construction enquiries and complaints, since the start of reporting the new KPI from October 2021, 94% of urgent enquiries and complaints were responded to within 2 working days. For | |
| | April to June in 2022, this figure is at 100%. In June 2022, 80 complaints were received. 98% relate to Phase 1. JF (HCC) requested that the 'other' category of complaints is clarified as to what is included. HS2 to action. | HS2 |
| | None of the 80 complaints in June 22 was escalated to the Construction Commissioner. In the last financial year, HS2 received over 1,600 complaints, which was a decrease from the previous year by 13%. | |
| | JF (HCC) noted that residents in Hertfordshire have raised concerns that complaints to the help desk have not made it through to the main works contractors and no response has been provided. VB (HS2) noted that the complaints help desk is widely publicized. Help desk complaints are all logged and stakeholders are advised accordingly on next steps. VB requested that any instances of complaints not being responded to are forwarded directly to . VB to investigate the issue with Align separately. | HS2 |
| | DW (WNC) raised a concern that the HS2 complaints website does not clarify the difference between a construction complaint and a service complaint. VB (HS2) noted that all complainants would receive a close out email to explain | HS2 |

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| | TA (Chair) to raise a concern with ICC regarding comments that have not been responded to. | Chair |

| | MH (HS2) provided an update on the involvement of SME's with the HS2 project highlighting some key involvements and the main contacts available for LPA's to promote SME involvement with HS2. | |
| | MH (HS2) suggested that any LPA's wishing to get in contact do so by contacting | |
| 9. | Landowner Agreements | |
| | AR (HS2) provided an update on the context for the need for landowner agreements and the process for facilitating landowner agreements. | |
| | DW (WNC) noted some pre-application discussions reference landscape mitigation which would be secured through landowner agreements however the role of LPA's regarding long term management is unclear. AR (HS2) noted that the responsibility for landscape maintenance sits with HS2 therefore responsibility for maintenance can only be passed over to landowners where there is confidence that maintenance will be upkept through the use of covenants over land. PG (HS2) noted that the starting point for LPA involvement is to approve the detail of the landscaping scheme at the outset which then must be implemented as approved by HS2. Any perceived breach of landscaping maintenance could then be raised through the complaints procedure and responded to accordingly. | |
| 10. | Appeals and Judicial Reviews Update | |
| | MD (HS2) noted a hearing for the Bromford Tunnel East Portal appeal (APP/HS2/18) was held on 27/04/22. HS2 will provide some additional drawings and the PINS will determine the appeal. The Waste Lane appeal (APP/HS2/19 Balsall Common (Waste Lane) Lorry Route is to be recover for determination by the SoS. There are two other appeals currently live (APP/HS2/20 WCC Borrow Pit No.2, APP/HS2/21 WCC Borrow Pit No.1) with third party representations being responded to. | |
| | A decision on the three Judicial Reviews (APP/HS2/14 A422 Brackley Road, APP/HS2/16 Wendover Green Lorry Route, APP/HS2/10-13 A413 Lorry Routes) has been handed down by the High Court on 21/07/22 dismissing the Judicial Reviews. | |
