- The name of the country of the central competent veterinary authority (CCVA) which has the legal authority to verify and certify the conformity to the attestations.
- Box I.2 The number used by the CCVA of the country to identify the certificate. The certificate number must appear on each page of the certificate.
- The name of the central competent veterinary authority (CCVA) which has the Box I.3 legal authority to verify and certify the conformity to the attestations.
- The name of the local competent veterinary authority (CCVA) which issued the Box I.4 certificate.
- Box I.5 The natural or legal person or entity dispatching the consignment.
- Box T.6 The natural or legal person or entity to which the consignment is destined at the time the certificate is issued.
- The name of the country where the products were collected from animals, processed and/or manufactured.

  The six-digit Harmonized System (HS) code is the common product identifier set up by the World Customs Organization. When several codes are possible, the exporter must confirm with the importer the correct code. Box I.14

- Box I.16 The appropriate temperature category (ambient, chilled, frozen) for transport and storage of the products.

  - Manufacturing Plant and CCVA Approval Number The establishment where the product was produced, including the approval number.
  - · Common Name of Product Common name means the name by which the product is generally known.
  - Species of origin The scientific name of the animal from which product was derived.
  - Type of Packaging The type of packaging used to ship the products (drums, barrels, cartons, etc.).
  - Number of packages The number of packages in the consignment.
  - Net quantity The net quantity of the product indicated by volume or weight in metric units.
  - Lot or batch number The lot identification system developed by the manufacturer to account for their production of the products.
