Pursuant to Regulation 16 of the above Regulations, the Offshore Petroleum Regulator for Environment and Decommissioning acting on behalf of the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (“the Secretary of State”) hereby gives notice of the Secretary of State’s decision to agree to the grant of consent and the decision by the Oil and Gas Authority (“the OGA”) to grant consent.

1. Following the Secretary of State's conclusion regarding the environmental effects of the project, and a decision made on the 11 October 2022, the Secretary of State agreed to the OGA's grant of consent and the OGA granted consent on 20 September 2023, so the project may proceed.
