JUDGMENT OF THE EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNAL

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The judgment of the Tribunal is that:

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- (1) The claimant's complaint in respect of dismissal for the reason or principal reason that the claimant made a protected disclosure (pursuant to section 103A of the Employment Rights Act 1996), having been withdrawn by the claimant is dismissed under Rule 52 of the Rules contained in Schedule 1 of the Employment Tribunals (Constitution and Rules of Procedure) Regulations 2013. The remainder of the claimant's claim shall continue, and a Final Hearing is listed to take place **before an Employment Judge and two members at the Glasgow Tribunals Centre, 20 York Street,**
