Fisheries Management Plans are set out in the Fisheries Act 2020 and are at the centre of UK fisheries management post-Brexit.




Plan led approach to fisheries management. They set out the polices needed to maintain or restore stocks to sustainable levels.



FMPs are a different way of working and they are being developed collaboratively with stakeholders.


Marine Management Southern North Sea demersal Non-Quota Species FMP




- Covers English waters of ICES areas 4b and 4c
- Focusing on demersal non-quota species (NQS);
- Red/Tub/Grey Gurnards
- Cuttlefish
- Squid
- Octopus
- John Dory
- Red mullet
- Lesser Spotted Dogfish
- Publication at the end of 2024



- Data poor, only 4 currently have stock assessments
- Mixed and multispecies fishery with many of the species being caught as by-catch with some targeted fisheries.
- Mainly larger, towed gear vessels catching the FMP species
- Emerging fisheries in the southern north sea (cuttlefish)





