

**EXPORT OF DAIRY PRODUCTS TO ANTIGUA - 5745EHC NOTES**

**FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE CERTIFYING OFFICIAL**

1. Export health certificate 5745EHC may be used for the export of milk and milk products to Antigua.

This certificate may be signed by an OV appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Scottish Government, Welsh Government or the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) Northern Ireland, who is on the appropriate panel for export purposes or who holds the appropriate Official Controls Qualification (Veterinary) (OCQ(V)) authorisation.

OVs must sign and stamp the health certificate with the OV stamp in any ink colour **OTHER THAN BLACK**.

2. Para **IV** 1. may be signed on the basis of oval marks which demonstrate compliance with EU Regulations (EC) 853/2004 and 854/2004 and Transitional Arrangements under which stocks produced in accordance with Council Directive 92/46/EEC, as implemented in GB by the Dairy Products (Hygiene) Regulations 1995 can be traded until 31/12/2009.
3. Paragraph **IV** 2. i) may be certified by the OV on behalf of the Department provided written authority from the APHA Centre of International Trade, Carlisle or the issuing office of DAERA has been received on form 618NDC.

5. Paragraph **IV** 2. ii) b). By accessing the link [http://www.oie.int/eng/normes/mcode/en\\_chapitre\\_3.6.2.htm](http://www.oie.int/eng/normes/mcode/en_chapitre_3.6.2.htm) the FMD virus inactivation procedures are explained at Article 3.6.2.5. (milk and cream for human consumption) and at Article 3.6.2.6. (milk for animal consumption).
6. Paragraph **IV** 3. refers to the BSE (No2) Order 1988.
7. Paragraph **IV** 4. This statement can be signed by an Official Veterinarian on the basis of the following:-

The Food Standards Agency, in association with the UK environmental agencies, monitors food and the environment in the UK. They publish an annual report - Radioactivity in food and the Environment - which summarises the results of monitoring. The results of this monitoring support the conclusion set out in the paragraph.

8. **Certified Copy Requirements - England, Wales and Scotland**

Guidance concerning return of certified copies of EHCs has changed and only specific certified copies are required to be returned to the APHA. Certifying OVs must return a certified copy of EHCs only for the following EHC types:

- if the exported commodity is cattle, pigs, sheep, goats or camelids;
- if the certificate was applied for manually and the application documents have been emailed to APHA and not applied for via the Exports Health Certificates Online (EHCO) system.

Certified copies should be emailed on the day of signature to the Centre for International Trade Carlisle (CITC) at the following address: [certifiedcopies@apha.gov.uk](mailto:certifiedcopies@apha.gov.uk).

For certificates that have been issued to the Certifying OV via the EHC system, the Certifying OV must complete the certifier portal with the status of the certificate and the date of signature.

A copy of all EHCs and supporting documentation certified must be retained for two years.

Certifying OVs are not required to return certified copies of other EHCs issued, however CITC may request certified copies of EHCs and supporting documentation in order to complete Quality Assurance checks or if an issue arises with the consignment after certification.

**DAERA Export Health Certificates: Provision of certified copies**

aPVPs certifying DECOL produced Export Health Certificates must return a legible, scanned copy of the final EHC to the relevant DAERA Processing Office within 1 working day of signing.

Good quality photographic copies will be accepted by the department, where obtaining a scanned copy is not feasible - for example, where 'on site' certification is undertaken and scanning facilities are not available.

For record purposes, a copy of the final Export Health Certificate and associated Support documents should be retained by the aPVP for a period of 2 years from the date of certification.

The Department will carry out periodic audits of all aspects of export certification to ensure that a high standard of certification is being maintained.

It is the exporter's responsibility to check the certificate against any relevant import permit or any advice provided by the competent authority in the importing country.
