REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Request response: TB in Deer (FOI2023/14013)

Thank you for your request for information of 17th July about Request response: TB in Deer (FOI2023/14013). APHA have handled your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIRs).

The EIRs apply to requests for environmental information, which is a broad category of information defined in regulation 2 of the EIRs. Public authorities are required to handle requests for environmental information under the EIRs. They give similar access rights to the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your information request and our response are set out below.

"Each year any wild deer that are shot and subsequently found to be infected with TB must be reported to DEFRA as TB in wild deer is a notifiable disease.

Each report submitted has data included which describes exactly where the animal was shot. The location data will be in the form of an OS grid reference or a LatLong coordinate. I am NOT interested in any personal details of the person reporting the diseased animal. My request is therefore that I would like the location data associated with each TB incidence in deer that has been notified in England and Wales since 2020.

My reason for requiring these data is so that I can correlate each data point with other publicly accessible data on deer distribution, badger distribution and TB breakdowns in individual farms.

I hope that this information is specific enough for you to find the raw data I request."

What information APHA have available can be found at Appendix 1.

The information that we have provided is a true reflection of the information that we have access to. We cannot guarantee the accuracy of this data, as we can only rely on the information that has been input by third parties.

Where information is missing it was not supplied to APHA originally.
