REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Brucella Canis information

Thank you for your request for information of 10th May about Brucella Canis. APHA have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your information request and our response are set out below.

"Please can you tell me what (correct to 1 decimal point) the sensitivity and specificity of the following Brucella canis tests are: SAT, iELISA, combined tests (SAT & iELISA). Please can you also tell me (correct to one decimal point) the 95% confidence interval around the sensitivity and specificity values for each of these tests/combination of tests is?"

The 95% confidence intervals for the combined (Brucella canis SAT + Brucella canis iELISA) test algorithm (where a sample is considered serologically positive if it is positive to either test and negative if it is negative to both tests (tests as used and performed at APHA) are:

Diagnostic specificity (DSp) = 0.989 (98.9%), 95% Confidence interval: 0.960 – 0.997

Diagnostic sensitivity (DSn) = 0.922 (92.2%), 95% Confidence interval: 0.839 - 0.976

For iELISA only

DSp = 0.991 (99.1%), 95% Confidence interval: 0.968 - 0.889 DSn = 0.896 (89.6%), 95% Confidence interval: 0.808 - 0.946

For SAT only

DSp = 0.998 (99.8%), 95% Confidence interval: 0.992 - 0.9997 DSn = 0.711 (71.1%), 95% Confidence interval = 0.613 - 0.795

These values may change as more samples of suitable provenance become available to support the validation.
