REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Brucella Canis information

Thank you for your request for information of 10th May about Brucella Canis information. APHA have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your information request and our response are set out below.

“Please can you tell me what brucella species the antigen used in a) your SAT test, and B) your iELISA test is derived from?”

The antigen used for SAT is derived from a less mucoid strain of Brucella canis. The antigen used for iELISA is a purified protein free outer membrane extract from Brucella abortus vaccine strain RB51 (a rough Brucella abortus strain whose dominant outer membrane antigen is the same as that possessed by B. canis).

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA and the government’s Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
