Distance learning courses are also known as 'correspondence courses'. Materials and learning resources are sent to students via post or email, and students must complete set tasks according to the course schedule.

On a distance learning course interaction with a tutor may involve online and face to face tutorials and individual guidance, or may only be when assignments are submitted for marking. It is rare to interact with fellow students, though for some courses there may be additional student forums or networks, learning events and residential schools.

In the fifth and sixth years of study students can also apply for the reduced rate maintenance loan from Student Finance England or Student Finance Wales.

Graduate entry accelerated programme

For an accelerated four-year medical or dentistry degree, graduates must pay part of their tuition fee for the first year of their course but can also apply for a fee loan from Student Finance England or Student Finance Wales to cover the remainder of their first-year tuition fee. In addition, they can apply for a partially means-tested loan for living costs from Student Finance England for the first year of their accelerated course. Or a full maintenance loan from Student Finance Wales for year one, and reduced rate loan for years two to four.

For years two to four of an accelerated four-year medical degree, the NHS will pay for part of graduates' tuition fees and graduates are also able to apply for a means-tested NHS bursary.
