12-23: Legacy Benefits - The Carer's Assistance (Carer's support payment) (Scotland) Consequential Amendments 2023

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Introduction

1. This memo gives guidance on The Carer's Assistance (Carer Support Payment) (Scotland) Regulations 2023 (Consequential Amendments) Order 2023¹ which come into force on 19.11.23.

Background

2. This order¹ makes changes to social security legislation to reflect the introduction of the Carer Support Payment (CSP) which replaces CA in Scotland.

Carer's Allowance

3. From 19.11.23 a claimant cannot have entitlement to both CA and CSP for the same day¹. Additionally, where two or more people are caring for the same severely disabled person, only one of them will be entitled to either CA or CSP for any day. It will be up to them to choose and elect who will be entitled to CA or CSP² by giving the DM a notice in writing signed by both carers specifying who should be entitled to CA or CSP³. If there is no election the Secretary of State should be satisfied that one carer has the relevant entitlement to the benefit, following consultation with the Scottish DM⁴.

Note: When a DM encounters a rival carer situation, a structured consultation process with the Scottish DM's, carefully considering all the key factors, should take place to ensure that the most appropriate carer is chosen.

Example 1

Mary and Sharon both care for Henry for at least 35 hours a week each. Mary lives in England and claims CA. Sharon lives in Scotland and claims CSP. Only one of them will be entitled to benefit for caring for Henry. Mary and Sharon decide themselves that Mary should have entitlement. Therefore, Mary receives CA. Sharon is not entitled to CSP for the period Mary is entitled to CA.

Example 2

David and Eric both care for Susan for at least 35 hours a week each. David lives in England and claims CA. Eric lives in Scotland and claims CSP. Only one of them will be entitled to benefit for caring for Susan. David and Eric both believe they should be entitled to claim and cannot decide between them who should be entitled. The DM should consult with the Scottish DM to determine which carer has the relevant entitlement.

State Pension and Retirement Pension

Deferring Entitlement to State Pension/Retirement Pension

Lump Sum Payments

4. <u>DMG 75405</u> et seq provides guidance on people entitled to a lump sum payment when they defer their RP. The amount of RP which would have been payable had it not been deferred does **not** include any pension, where for all of an accrual period, a person has been in receipt of CSP¹.

Increments

5. <u>DMG 75349</u> et seq provides guidance on people entitled to increments when they defer their RP. DMG <u>74501</u> et seq provides guidance on people entitled to increments when they defer their SP. When a person is deferring their

1. RP¹ or

2. SP²

they will not be entitled to increments for any day in a period of deferment when they are in receipt of

Carer Support Payment.

Entitlement to Age Addition

6. <u>DMG 75281</u> et seq provides guidance on people entitled to age addition. This will include a person in receipt of CSP¹.

Income support

Prescribed category of person

7. People are entitled to IS if they meet the conditions of entitlement, including where they are in a prescribed category¹ (see <u>DMG 20081 et seq</u>). This includes people who care for another person and are entitled to CA². From 19.11.23, the category includes people who care for another person and are entitled to CSP³.

Entitlement to premiums

8. When considering entitlement to any premiums, where there are references to a CA, there shall be a reference to a CSP¹.

Earnings

Definition of sums to be disregarded

9. From 19.11.23 the definition of sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings¹ will also include a CSP carer's assistance given in accordance with these regulations².

10. The disregard of £20 applied to a carer's earnings where the claimant's applicable amount includes a

CP and the carer is in receipt of CA also applies where the claimant is in receipt of CSP¹.

Income other than earnings

11. Disregard any amount of CSP that is in excess of the amount the claimant would receive if they had an entitlement to CA¹.

Claim for Cat A or Cat B Retirement Pension

Definition

12. From 19.11.23 neither a claim to, nor an award of, CSP prevents the Secretary of State from notifying the beneficiary that a claim for Cat A or Cat B RP is not required¹.

Jobseeker's Allowance

Waiting days

13. <u>DMG 20902-DMG 20903</u> gives guidance on when a JSA claimant or a joint-claim couple do not have to serve waiting days, including where entitlement to JSA begins within 12 weeks of the end of entitlement to specified benefits¹. From 19.11.23, CSP² is added to the list of qualifying benefits.

Linked periods

14. <u>DMG 21027</u> gives guidance on linked periods. From 19.11.23 a linked period will include when a claimant is entitled to a CSP¹.

Carers, remunerative work and joint claimants

15. For the purpose of whether a JSA claimant is

1. in remunerative work where they are a carer 1 (see DMG 20252) or

2. a member of a joint claim couple who does not have to satisfy the conditions of entitlement² because they are a carer³ (see <u>DMG 20017</u>).

CSP⁴ is added to the list of qualifying benefits from 19.11.23. See <u>Chapter 20</u> (JSA conditions of entitlement) for further details.

16. When considering entitlement to any premiums, where there are references to a CA, there shall be a reference to a CSP¹.

Definition of sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings

17. From 19.11.23 the sums to be disregarded in the calculation of earnings¹ will also include a CSP carer's assistance given in accordance with these regulations².

Earnings

18. The disregard of £20 applied to a carer's earnings where the claimant's applicable amount includes a CP and the carer is in receipt of CA also applies where the claimant is in receipt of CSP¹.

Definition of sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings

19. From 19.11.23 the sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings¹ will also include a CSP carer's assistance given in accordance with these regulations².

Income other than earnings

20. From 19.11.23 disregard any amount of CSP that is in excess of the amount the claimant would receive if they had an entitlement to CA¹.

Change of circumstances supersession where award of CSP ends

Definition of effective date

21. From 19.11.23 the definition of date from which a decision superseded under section 10 takes effect¹ will also include a CSP carer's assistance given in accordance with these regulations².

22. Where

1. the claimant is a disabled person or a disabled person's partner and

2. a decision awarding benefit is superseded to the claimant's advantage and

3. the reason for the supersession is that payment of an award of CSP in respect of that disabled person has ended

the superseding decision is effective from the day after the last day that CSP was paid to a person other than the claimant or the claimant's partner¹. <u>DMG 02010</u> (main heading) and <u>DMG 04226</u> are affected.

State Pension Credit

Income other than earnings

23. CSP is a social security benefit and is taken into account as income other than earnings¹. Disregard any amount of CSP that is in excess of the amount the claimant would receive if they had an entitlement to CA².

Notional income

24. DMG <u>85447</u> explains that where a claimant to whom <u>DMG 85441</u> applies is in receipt of an overlapping benefit or allowance the amount of RP income they shall be treated as having is the RP they are entitled to minus the amount of the benefit or allowance in payment¹. From 19.11.23 CSP is included as such an overlapping benefit or allowance².

Additional amount for the severely disabled

25. <u>DMG 78030</u> and <u>78610</u> gives guidance that when considering entitlement to an additional amount

for claimants who are severely disabled, no amount is payable in respect of a claimant if someone is in receipt of

1. a CA **or**

2. the carer element of UC

in respect of caring for them¹. From 19.11.23 CSP is included in the list of qualifying benefits².

Additional amount for carers

26. <u>DMG 78100</u> and <u>78620</u> gives guidance that an additional amount for carers may be awarded for each claimant who is entitled to CA. From 19.11.23 that also includes those claimants entitled to CSP¹.

Social Fund Funeral Payment

27. <u>DMG 39408</u> and <u>Appendix 6 to DMG Chapter 39</u> gives guidance on arrears of benefits payable to the deceased not being counted as assets of the deceased when considering deductions from the amount of award of funeral payment. From 19.11.23 arrears of CSP payable to the deceased as at the date of death are excluded from the assets of the deceased¹

Employment and Support Allowance

First contribution condition

28. <u>DMG 41032</u> gives guidance on relaxation of the first contribution condition¹ where specified conditions are met, including where the ESA claimant is entitled to CA in the last complete tax year immediately before the relevant benefit year in which the first day of LCW occurred². From 19.11.23 this includes where the claimant is entitled to CSP³.

Waiting days

29. <u>DMG 41103</u> gives guidance on when an ESA claimant does not have to serve waiting days, including where entitlement to ESA begins within 12 weeks of the end of entitlement to specified benefits¹. From 19.11.23, CSP² is added to the list of qualifying benefits.

Definition of amounts

30. From 19.11.23 the amounts¹ will also include a CSP carer's assistance given in accordance with these regulations².

Amount of ESA payable where entitlement is for less than a week

31. When calculating the amount of ESA payable, where there are references to a CA, there shall be a reference to a CSP¹.

Entitlement to premiums

32. When considering entitlement to any premiums, where there are references to a CA, there shall be a reference to a CSP¹.

Income other than earnings

33. From 19.11.23 disregard any amount of CSP that is in excess of the amount the claimant would receive if they had an entitlement to CA¹.

State Pension, Retirement Pension and Widowed Parent's Allowance

Additional Pension and Engaged in Caring

34. <u>DMG 75549</u> et seq and <u>63062</u> et seq provides guidance that a person who is engaged in caring can receive a class 3 credit towards satisfying the single contribution condition. This will include a person engaged in caring for a period of up to 12 weeks,

1. before they become entitled to CSP^1 or

2. after they cease to be entitled to CSP^2

However, 2. does not apply if a claimant continues to be entitled to a credit after entitlement to CSP

Additional Pension and Applications for NI credits

35. <u>See DMG 75556</u> and <u>63069</u> for guidance on applications for NI credits when engaged in caring. NI credits cannot be awarded in respect of claims to CSP, or the Carer Credit, for any period where the person was a married woman who had elected to pay a reduced rate of NI contributions (Married Woman's Reduced Rate Election)¹.
